Grades: K - 2

Beginning Violin for Grades 3-6

Grades: 3rd - 6th

Cost: \$30

Does your student love music? The elementary years are a perfect time to try an instrument! In this beginning violin class, we'll learn to read music (treble clef) and play lots of games to practice note-reading and rhythm. Using the Suzuki Violin I book, we'll learn how to hold the violin and bow and how to place the fingers of the left hand correctly to make beautiful music! 15-30 minutes of daily practice is recommended along with brief weekly music-reading exercises. Students will participate in a showcase for parents at the end of each semester, and additional opportunities to perform (Fine Arts Night, Christmas music at an assisted living facility, etc.) may also arise.

Parents are required to provide their students with their own appropriately-sized violin and bow.

Grades: MS

Constitutional Literacy

Grades: HS

Cost: \$30

There has never been a more important time to understand and value the importance of our constitution. This course is written from a constitutionally conservative perspective. We will also be doing some activities outside of Friday school as we learn to serve others and our nation with our constitutional rights. We will also be having some guest speakers. This will be geared for 9-12th grade. Please glance at the curriculum and make sure that it will work for your student since some topics might not work for every family. Homework required. This class counts as 1 credit hour towards Government/Civics.

Dr. Michael Farris, founder and chancellor of Patrick Henry College and chairman of the Home School Legal Defense Association, brings the U.S. Constitution to life for modern Americans by examining these questions: What does the Constitution actually say? What does it mean? What were the Founders' intentions for this document? And how is it being interpreted to shape our laws and way of life today?

Students will first read the workbook chapter, then watch the DVD lecture with the workbook, pausing and answering questions as they watch the video. Lessons contain the following segments:

- Purpose: lists objectives
- Parlance: lists legal terminology with space to copy the definition of each word
- Preamble: the topic introduction with historical background or framed in the context of everyday life
- Ponder: a digging deeper section that tests knowledge and comprehension with study questions
- Payoff: a summarization of the issues and arguments
- Probe: assignments to self-explore how concepts relate to contemporary issues

Grades: 7th - 9th

Cost: \$65 (includes all books). Sibling Fee: \$30 (with shared reading books)

Every student, from the most reluctant reader to the budding novelist, benefits from strengthening language skills, and all are welcome in this literature-based English class, which covers reading, writing, vocabulary, and grammar. Using both classic literature and contemporary favorites, we’ll dive into fiction, nonfiction, biography, drama, poetry, short story, and journalism. Vocabulary words and writing assignments will be drawn from the literature we read, and grammar exercises will focus on effective communication in writing rather than obscure terminology and rules. Health/PE

Drawing I and II

Grades: HS

Cost: \$70

This course will cover the very basics of drawing and will begin with an introduction to line, value, and form. Throughout the course, students will learn how to see things differently and how to apply what is seen in the physical world to a 2D piece of paper.

We will also practice one, two and three-point perspective drawing. Learning how to draw takes a lot of patience and practice, but the results are very rewarding. In order to make progress, homework will be assigned which must be completed during the week. I will supply each student with a set of graphite pencils, professional-grade colored pencils (Prismacolor), pencil sharpener, blender tools, drawing pads, and erasers. This class can count towards .05 or 1 full credit hour for high school art, depending on how much time your student spends at home on the homework assessments.

Personal Finance

Grades: HS

Cost: \$45

Foundations in Personal Finance for Homeschool by Dave Ramsey. Students will learn the fundamentals of fiscal responsibility. Over the school year we will work through the student text, class room videos, activities and instruction to cover the entire course. In addition to the 1 hour of classroom instruction per week your student should expect 2 hours of homework per week to accomplish 75 hours needed for this class. We will provide your student with a syllabus and lesson plan. They are responsible to do their homework. Tests will be administered and graded in class; however, it is the parent's responsibility for keeping records. This class can be counted as .05 high school credit hour.
