Grace Homeschoolers Class Descriptions 2025-2026 (All fees are non-refundable)

Grade K-1

Morning Movement: Stretch and Pray (1st Hour)

Teacher: Rebecca K.

Cost: \$25

Start the day with moving meditation and prayer for Kindergarteners. As we stretch and move our bodies we will focus on the goodness of God and what He says about us. Then we will move into games and activities. music and imagination to glorify Jesus. This class will set the tone for a kingdom-kids kind of day while having fun with friends.

Art (2nd Hour)

Cost: \$35

Join us for Art class, where students will complete easy-to-follow projects using a variety of media. This course is designed to introduce the basic elements and principles of art, in an age-appropriate manner. Children will experiment with painting, drawing, and sculpting, allowing them to explore different techniques and materials. Through these activities, students will gain a foundational understanding of artistic concepts while expressing their creativity.

Flying Creatures (3rd Hour)

Cost: \$35

Using information from Apologia's Flying Creatures of the Fifth Day, we will be learning all about God's incredible flying creatures. Through a variety of hands-on activities, we will cover interesting topics like bird identification, feathers, flying, nesting, and hatching. Our study will continue by investigating bats and insects, including echolocation, metamorphosis, and bug defenses. If you want to continue more in-depth study at home, you may purchase your own textbook and journal, but it is not required for the class.

Magic School Bus (4th Hour)

Cost: \$45

In this class, your student will embark on an exciting journey learning all about science through the Magic School Bus series. They will watch a 26-minute episode and do a hands-on activity or experiment, pertaining to that episode. There will be no homework but maybe some fun book recommendations to go along with what we are learning in class for you to read with them at home.

GRADE 2-3

Art (1st Hour) Teacher: Karen W.

Cost: \$30

Join us as we explore the world of art, using the ARTistic Pursuits art curriculum! We will be learning all about what artists do, what artists see and where we find art. Students will develop observational skills while creating their own original works of art and enjoying using many different types of mediums. This is a fun curriculum that teaches art, art history and art appreciation while engaging the child at their level.

Science: "The Wonder of Creation" (2nd Hour)

Teacher: Jesse/Jenny N.

Cost: \$35

In each class we will combine an Indescribable Devotion (by Louie Giglio) with shows like Wild Kratts, National Geographic for Kids, Answers in Genesis, SciShow Kids, etc. to teach the students about the incredible world God has created for us to live in! We will also incorporate crafts, science projects, and a few experiments into the lessons. Our goal in this class is not only to teach about science, but to put God at the center of all we do, while showing the students just how wonderfully awesome He is! We are going to have tons of fun and we look forward to getting to know each student who joins our class!

Novel study "The Borrowers" (3rd Hour)

Teacher: Valentina M.

Cost: \$20

In this class, students will engage in a read-aloud of The Borrowers by Mary Norton. The book consists of 20 chapters, and each class will focus on listening to one chapter. Throughout the course, students will expand their vocabulary by learning new words encountered in the text. They will also work through a study guide, which includes questions and activities to enhance their comprehension of the story. Additionally, students will create a lapbook (a hands-on project that visually represents key elements and themes from the novel). At the end of the year, students will watch the movie adaptation of The Borrowers and compare it to the story, discussing the similarities and differences between the two.

Active Adventures (4th Hour)

Cost: \$35

Engage Your Body and Brain! This class will consist of a mix between inside and outside games. Through play, each student will be encouraged through teamwork, sharing, taking turns and leadership. Indoor games will be board games, card games, bingo, etc. Outdoor games will be kickball, 4 square, scavenger hunts and more. This will be a fun and social class.

Grade 4-5

American Girl (1st Hour)

Teacher: Dolly P. Cost: \$40

Join us as we adventure through American history through the eyes of young girls! We plan to immerse ourselves in American history as we learn about these early periods. We will cover various subjects such as geography, history, and famous people, and as we discover each American girl. We suggest that you read each doll's historical novels on their own, outside of class as we won't have time to do reading in class. We will be covering some tough topics as mentioned in the books like slavery and war at an elementary level. Please make sure that you are comfortable with the topics in the books.

Model Building (1st Hour)

Cost: \$180

This class will be hands on, STEM learning, through building models each week. We will use building kits to construct a variety of models from battery powered vehicles, wooden machines, metal planes, and more. Every student will be able to take home each model constructed. All supplies will be provided.

National Parks (2nd Hour)

Teacher: Lila H. Cost: \$35

Join us on an exciting journey through our 50 states National Parks. In this class, your student will engage in History, Science and Geography as we dive deep into these magnificent places. Most work will be done in class, with some homework assigned along the way.

Air-Dry Clay Creations (3rd Hour)

Cost: \$50

Join us for some creative learning! Using air-dry clay each week, our class will sculpt, mold, and shape unique clay pieces, from figurines to decorative items. All supplies will be provided.

4M: Music, Movement, Memory, and Monologue! (3rd and 4th Hour)

Teacher: Cathy B.

Cost: \$30

This 2-hour class is designed to help students learn basic facts from 9 subjects as well as the skills of presentation through music, movement, and learning lots of facts in many subjects. We use the Claritas Classical Academy memory work curriculum and will be in Cycle 4 (the material is mostly different from what we studied in 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 with a few weeks overlapping). It is a Christian based curriculum that presents 9 subjects each week - Math, Science, English, History, Geography, Latin, Timeline of History, Scripture, and Hymns. Students will have the opportunity to show memorization proficiency with the memory work by subject or as a whole through quarterly, semester, or annual recitations if they choose. In addition, we will do a presentation or speech every couple of weeks - this can be as simple as "show and tell" for the younger students all the way up to written or researched speeches for the older students.

*Additional Cost: Per family (not per student) has the choice of either purchasing the full cycle 4 curriculum for \$49 (or find it used for much less) OR purchase a \$15, one-month subscription on CrossSeven.org. If you choose to do the one month option, you would be responsible for printing the needed work for the year, or maintaining the subscription throughout the school year to retain access. If your student chooses to test for proficiency, I highly recommend the CDs/music download option as well. We use these in class each week and they aid in memorization. Please be sure to get **CYCLE 4** material.
